WAGMAN ELECTED 47th S.E.R.

On the strength of a unanimous ballot, Brother Alan M. Wagman became Sigma Alpha Rho's fortyseventh Supreme Exalted Ruler. In so doing, the delegates chose a man of unequalled popularity as well as outstanding fraternal experience Having previously and ability. served as Exalted Mortal Ruler and Supreme Mortal Ruler, Alan will now lead the fraternity in the forthcoming fraternal year. He served as Mu Rho of Tau XI for two years, during which time the Chapter won numerous Council and International awards. Alan was also Exalted Ruler of the Philadelphia District Council, and has the unique honor of being Honorary Active in both his Chapter and his Council.

Following the Supreme Exalted Ruler's election, the delegates paid tribute to Past Supreme Exalted Ruler, Brother Fred H. Ratner. After being officially recommended by the Judicial Tribunal, Brother Ratner was bestowed International Honorary Activity by the cheering delegates.

Brother Stuart M. Discount won unanimous acclamation of the delegates for the position of Supreme Mortal Ruler. Honorary Active in the Zeta Tau Chapter where he served as the 1973 Shapiro Sigma Rho, Stu is also Tonorary Active in Philadelphia District Council which he served last year as Exalted Ruler. Stu has served the International Fraternity as Supreme Chancellor and Supreme Scribe.

After declining to run for S.M.R., Brother Brad Whitten was unanimously re-elected Exalted Mortal Ruler. Brad was Sigma Rho of the 1972 Shaefer and 1973 "Abbie" Beta Iota Chapter. For his great accomplishments he was granted

the status of Beta Iota Honorary Active. Brad also has held the offices of Exalted Ruler of Eastern District Council and Supreme Chancellor.

In a hotly contested election, Brother Steve Greenberg was chosen Supreme Exchequer over Brother Jeff Chester of the Eta Chapter. Holding almost every Omega Chapter office, Steve was granted the status of Honorary Active. He was Member-at-Large and Grand Exchequer of P.D.C. and has served the fraternity in the positions of Supreme Scribe and Supreme Exchequer.

After declinations by Brothers Bruce Lane, Alpha Iota and Dave Schwartz, Sigma, the delegates once more unanimously agreed, and Brother Jeff Frankel was selected Supreme Scribe. Jeff served as Sigma Rho of Alpha Iota Chapter, and as the Metropolitan District Council's Grand Exchequer and Exalted Ruler. He is Honorary Active in his chapter and council for his work and dedication in both.

Brothers Paul Bernstein and Bruce Lane were elected to the positions of Supreme Chancellors in another hard fought contest. Paul, of the Beta Iota Chapter, is serving this year as Eastern District Council's Exalted Ruler. Past Sigma Rho and Honorary Active in his Chapter, Bruce is now Exalted Ruler of the Metropolitan District Council.

For the three Chancellor-at-Large posts there were seven nominations and several declinations. After a great deal of discussion and controversy, Brothers Gary Discount, Zeta Tau and Glenn Perlmutter and Dave Schwartz, Sigma were elected.

Moved by this great loss and his deep interest in Sigma Alpha Rho, he established the Abramson Memorial Award—a beautiful cup to be awarded annually to that Chapter which exhibits the greatest degree of fraternal activity throughout the year. Sigma Rho Henry Doner accepted the award in behalf of the Epsilon Chapter from Jerry N. Krader, P.S.E.R. The realization of winning the "Abbie" was the second in the past four years for Epsilon.

Under the leadership of Sigma Rho Steve Koffs the Zeta XI Chapter was awarded the Harold J. Pastner Memorial Award. As Sigma Alpha Rho's most improved chapter, Zeta XI exhibited increased activity in every fraternal endeavor.

Zeta XI was also presented with the Howard B. Pastor Memorial Award for doing the most to foster Inter-Chapter Relations, the Leonard Goldberg Memorial Award for outstanding effort in scholastic achievement, the Isreal Margolis Award for contributing the most to the Irving Rathblott Scholarship Fund, the Bernard Defren Memo-
